With increasing levels of anxiety being experienced throughout society, churches are reporting higher rates of burnout and turnover among leaders, increased blaming and victim-thinking among members, abrupt movement into and out of ministry, more destructive conflict, sudden withdrawal and departure of members from the life of the church. In addressing these trends, church leaders have learned that short-term solutions and quick-fixes do little to address the multi-generational patterns which characterize the functioning of congregations and other church organizations.
