Administrative Team Update

Happy New Year! As I wrote in a letter to pastors on New Year’s Day, we do not know “what joys and sorrows the next 365 days will bring.” 2014 is only a few days old. We anticipate a year of growth and opportunities. Since much of the growth in our lives comes from struggle, we may anticipate challenges along the way. May we end 2014 more in love with Jesus, more trusting of God’s goodness and more willing to risk obedience to the Holy Spirit.

Two events I look forward to attending later this month are the Northern Michigan Pastor-Spouse retreat and an Advisory Council meeting. David Miller will provide input for the retreat and I invite your prayers for the couples who will attend. I missed the fall Advisory Council meeting

because I was on sabbatical, and look forward to connecting with this group soon. Gene Hartman, conference moderator-elect, is chair of the Advisory Council and will lead the meeting.

At the end of January every year, the moderators and conference ministers of Illinois, Ohio, Central District and IN-MI conferences gather for a semi-annual coordination meeting. Even though we are four distinct conferences, there are opportunities and concerns we have in common, and we find it beneficial to touch base. It is a gift to have co-workers like Tom Kauffman, Lois Kaufmann and Chuck Neufeld.

A higher number of congregations are searching for and credentialing pastors at this time, so there are extra search committees and interviews for Doug to coordinate. Since the number of searches are again climbing, we are considering options to effectively manage the increased volume. Also, Doug may be called to jury duty. While we don't yet know what impact that might have on our schedule, we will work to keep congregational processes moving along.

Congregations faithfully engaging the world God loves will encounter new and challenging situations. Kern Road Mennonite Church is hosting a Healthy Congregations seminar on February 7-8 and inviting other congregations to join them. IN-MI Conference has been contacted by the John Howard Yoder Discernment Group about sharing the conference story regarding the disciplinary process of Yoder. The Administrative Team wants to be constructively engaged with this process, and have begun considering how to respond to the layers of questions involved in this process.

The Advancement Team met recently and set out some next steps that we are following. This is important work as we consider how to carry out sustainable ministry on behalf of our community of congregations that is Indiana-Michigan Mennonite Conference. It is also important as congregations help their members think about how commitments to Jesus impact their financial decisions. I will continue working with the team and other leadership groups as we pursue our plan in 2014.

Major business of the day included continued work on a review of our conference structure implemented 4.5 years ago. Len Harms, our representative on the Amigo Centre Board, invited responses to several initiatives Amigo is considering to enhance their mission and ministry as well as make it more viable financially. We appreciate his work with the Board on our behalf.

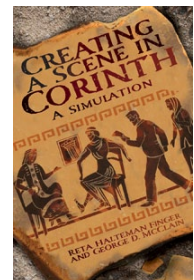
Transitional Ministry Training
