Annual Sessions 2020: Built Together Breaking down diving walls; building meaningful connections

Pastors, delegates and friends of Indiana-Michigan Mennonite Conference gathered over Zoom on June 19-20 for Annual Sessions 2020. The theme, "Built Together", comes from Paul's words in Ephesians 2:11-22 and reminds the Church that worldly divisions and hostility have been abolished through Christ's redemptive work. Followers of Jesus are now being "built together" into one holy, living structure for the glory of God.

Members of the Goshen Mennonite Ministers Council chose the theme in the Fall of 2019 and it turned out to be incredibly poignant in light the current circumstances.

The guest teacher for the weekend, Safwat Marzouk (Anabaptist Mennonite Biblical Seminary, Elkhart, IN), challenged listeners to think about what are the diving walls built in congregations and communities. He asked, "How do we move from activism to welcome the stranger, to embodying integration in our congregations?"

Speakers this year were Dan Miller (conference pastor of IMMC, Goshen, IN), Joanne Gallardo (Berkey Avenue Mennonite Church,










There is a sense of satisfaction following Annual Sessions. Satisfaction that planning paid off, that challenges were met. Satisfaction that the gathering was encouraging. Satisfaction as gifted leaders accomplished something we hadn't done before — hold the whole event online! Much excellent content is available on the website.

And there is another layer of response – frustration, discomfort. The coronavirus – the reason we moved online – has changed our lives. Gathering in person was not safe. Coronavirus kills people who are loved and who are important to their families. It brings to light disparities in our healthcare and financial systems. It separates us.

I've recently been remembering a story my mother-inlaw, Mildred Zook, told about herself. Her friends would come to her and say, "Mildred I have a question and I want your second opinion." I don't know what that first opinion was about, but her second response was better. That's kind of the way it is. Reactions come in layers. The first and most visible layer might be anger or resistance, the second might be fear, and the third might be sadness. Or the first layer could be caution, followed by celebration.

Layers. There are devastating consequences of the pandemic. There are opportunities. We can grieve what stares us in the face. We can do things we have not done before. We can change and make change. Annual Sessions reminded us we are being built together into a dwelling place for God. God is with us.

What can you do that you haven't done before? What's your second opinion?
