Focus

One need: God to meet us in the wilderness and to intervene in the injustices we perpetuate in our faith communities and in this chaotic and unjust world.

One image: Doing a New Thing

One message: God is the one who acted throughout history, who is acting today, and who will continue to act. God is calling IMMC to new ways of being together: God is growing our intercultural competence, God is welcoming all at the table; and God is inviting youth and young adults to join in leadership and discernment.

Children's Time

Purpose: the point of this children's time/story is to help the children live into their gifts and calling as part of the congregation now, not just when they're grown up.

Preparation: think about or list the new things that your church has tried in the last 5 years or so. They do not have to be things that you still do (actually it's better if you have things that may not have worked but you learned new things from them not working). It might also be helpful to know who planned for or came up with the ideas. Connect with congregational leaders (pastor, board members, elders, etc.) to find out who will be present that day or have a picture ready to show the children these people.

Materials: printed image of a <u>magnifying</u> <u>glass</u> and a <u>thought bubble</u> for each child.

Lesson: With the children gather around, read the IMMC Theme Verse for 2024: Isaiah 43:19. Tell the children about the new things that your church has tried over the past 5 years or so. If you have time, you may want to try going into detail on one of those things and what it means to you.

Next, talk about how even though God is the same yesterday, today, and tomorrow, God wants to do new things with us. Sometimes it's hard to see new things right away.

Then ask the children, "Who is the church?" They may give a variety of answers, but the answer we're looking for is that "All of us together are the church." One of the gifts that children bring to the church is energy and new ideas. And we believe some of those come from God. But sometimes we don't always listen or see what God is doing.

Show the image of the magnifying glass that you printed. Invite the children to think of new things they have seen around the church and to either write or draw those on in the magnifying glass.

Then show them the image of the thought bubble. Invite the children to think write or draw new ideas that they have for the church to try. At this point, invite church leaders to stand and tell the children to give the paper with their idea on it to one of these leaders (parents may need to help to make these connections).

Close the time with the children reminding them that they are an important part of the church and that you're grateful for them. Consider offering a prayer for the Holy Spirit to give them ideas to share and for leaders to be open to new ideas from God.
